history of the city's important sites with a focus on the diverse architecture of the city. We will walk through Havana's oldest neighborhood to learn about the historic, architectural, and cultural significance of this area which was

declared a World Heritage Site in 1982 by UNESCO. Explore the four main plazas of the 18th-century colony: **Plaza de Armas**, which originally housed the main administrative buildings of the colony; **Plaza Vieja**, the oldest of the plazas; **Plaza**

de la Cathedral, site of the baroque cathedral of Havana, and **Plaza de San Francisco**, site of the basilica of San Francisco and the old Havana stock exchange.
