April 29 2022 :

9:00am Meeting with ICAP, the Cuban Institute for Friendship with the People for a discussion on the current relationship between the US and Cuba.

11:00m Explanation of the history and development of Havana by an architect/urban planner, explanation of the social and political effects on

the development of the Cuban Capital (Miguel Coyula requested).

12:30m Lunch in Old Havana

2:00pm Group breaks up to isit to the Museum of the Revolution (for those that have been you can experience the Bellas Artes Museum) or enjoy free time along the Prado.

Enjoy a guided Walking City Tour of Havana, a UNESCO World 4:00pm Heritage Site. Delegates also have time to engage with Cubans at their art studios, galleries and markets where participants will meet with Cuban artists and find out first hand how artist negotiate between the tourist market, a socialist economy and new opportunities for individual entrepreneurship. Visit the four major historical squares of Cuba. Historian's massive efforts to restore Old Havana buildings, attract tourism and new investment, and improve social services for local residents. See buildings and homes in different stages of reconstruction, meet with neighborhood residents. Learn about how tourism impacts economic good.

6:00pm Break to debrief, swim or relax. Dinner and Evening are free for personal exploration

> **Optional hotel Activity:** enjoy a short and then a conversation with Gloria Rolando Among her best known works are Cuba, My Footsteps in Baraguá (1996), a history of the West Indian community in eastern Cuba, Eyes of the Rainbow (1997), a **film** about Assata Shakur, and a three-part series on the 1912 massacre of members of the Partido Independiente de Color (Independent Party of Color). She will talk about race and gender in Cuba, and answer your questions about filmmaking.

Excursion to Cienfuegos, Trinidad and Santa Clara

May 3, : (B, L)

9:00am

Check out of our hotel and then we are off to **Cienfuegos**, known as the "Pearl of the South". It was founded by the French, which lends it a distinctly European flavor, with a wide Parisian-style boulevard and elegant colonnades. Like Havana, Cienfuegos has a beautiful Malecón, where fisherman cast nets and locals socialize. If possible on the weekend, we will visit the Korimakao Cultural Project in Ciénega de Zapata, an area famous for its tropical wetlands. Korimakao is a project founded in 1992 to bring theatre, music, and dance to remote areas of Cuba.

3:00 pm

After lunch, we head along the picturesque **Bay of Pigs (Bahia de Cochinos)** past the site where the landing of U.S. sponsored counter-revolutionary exile militia occurred in 1961. Today there is a museum here that recounts the events of this conflict which resulted in the first defeat of a U.S backed take-over in Latin America.

On arrival to Cienfuegos we settle into our hotel before taking a walk around the city to learn it's history.

May 5th Trinidad (B,L)

9:30am Check out of our hotel and depart for the beautiful colonial city of Trinidad is a UNESCO World Heritage site, and home to many beautiful and photogenic colonial buildings. We are near the lovely Valle de los Ingenios (Valley of Sugar mills) and Playa Ancón, with its long stretches of unspoiled, white sand beaches. We begin with a guided cultural tour of Trinidad where we have options to visit museums such as:

Museo Lucha contra Bandidos, Architecture Museum and Museo Romantico.

At the Afro Cuban temple to Yemaya we can learn about the Santeria religion and it's deities from the official caretaker – the Santero priest Israel Ernesto Bravo Vega.

After lunch we have time to visit an Afro Cuban Folkloric dance group that performs

shows at the club Palenque. Gisela Zerquera, the director of the ballet will welcome us into the venue by the where they train and perform before taking on an optional Cuban salsa class. After you have free time to wander the streets and exchange with local artists.

Dinner and Evening are free to explore. We recommend the Casa de Trova.

May 6th Topes De Collantes (B,D)

9:30am We are off to explore the beauty of Cuba's rich biodiversity today. We will Travel to the Escambre Mountains and explore the beautiful reserve, at the **Topes de Collantes.** We will visit with local **CITMA** staff to learn about biodiversity protection.

2:30pm Enjoy an ecology walk, el **Paseo Ecologico** and a 2 mile hike in the afternoon for those that like to the **Caburni Falls.**

5:30pm Return to Trinidad for local night life and dinner together.

*for those that don't want to hike you can enjoy a day here in town or take a cab to enjoy Playa Ancon.

May 7 th Santa Clara to Havana (B,D)

8:00 am Breakfast at the hotel

9:00am COVID antigen tests.

10:00 am Returning to Havana we pass by the Manaca Iznaga 16km East of Trinidad in the **Valle de los Ingenios**. A 144 foot tower was built to watch over the slaves as they worked, and it has a sugar cane press that the slaves used to operate. The village around the mansion is inhabited by direct descendants of the slaves.

Continuing, we stop in at the town of Santa Clara, a key city in the Cuban Revolution. Upon entering Santa Clara, we will see the **iconic statue and memorial of Ernesto Ché Guevara**, built to commemorate his death and that of the revolutionaries who died along with him in Bolivia.

Return to Havana and check back in to hotels.
