9:00am Check out and depart for our excursion to the historic coffee plantation **Cafetal Isabélica** which was included in the UNESCO World Heritage List as part of the archaeological landscape of the first coffee plantations in southeastern Cuba in 2000. We will learn about how the Víctor Constatan grew corn, cocoa, and coffee grown after he fled Saint Domingue, today's Haiti. He named the plantation after his wife Isabel María. He was one of the French settlers who fled Saint Domingue's slave revolt.

9:00 am Invited Speaker to hotel to give a historical overview of the development of Havana (Requested architect and urban planner *Miguel Coyula*). Here you will understand the history and the current political economy of Cuba.

11:00 am Enjoy a guided **Walking City Tour of Havana**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Delegates also have time to engage with Cubans at their art studios, galleries and markets where participants will meet with Cuban artists and find out first hand how artist negotiate between the tourist market, a socialist economy and new opportunities for individual

entrepreneurship. Visit the four major historical squares of Cuba, we will not gloss over their use during the slave trade. Today, the historian of the city's massive efforts to restore Old Havana 's buildings, attracts tourism and new investment to improve social services for local residents.

Lunch in old Havana at la **Callesa Real.** Then we continue our City Tour that includes an exchange with the well known Cuban artist **Choco.**

3:oopm We learn about the history of the Literacy Campaign in Cuba with an informative visit to **the Literacy Museum**. This museum documents how Cuba educated its entire population and the programs that it inspires around the world today.

3:00pm Casa De Africa in Old Havana to learn about the history of Africans in Cuba and we examine slavery from 1520 till 1886. The museum focuses on the continent of Africa and Cuba's African heritage, reflecting in a simple, but deep way, history, religion, art, wisdom, and emancipation battles. The Casa de África is devoted to research and the promotion of African culture and how it has shaped and defined Cuban culture.

4:30pm Enjoy an intimate discussion of Race in Cuba with Gisela Arandia. She is a journalist, social activist, and researcher on issues of race and society in contemporary Cuba!
