Visit a traditional Maasai village, meet with villagers and have conversation about indigenous culture and changes (e.g. transition from pastoralism or agriculture) occurring in Maasailand. Talk to elders about their pastoral way of life, education of youth, beliefs, rituals, and living in harmony with nature.

Meet with an Olaiboni (spirit healer) and elder women herbalists.
